POYi is the oldest and one of the most prestigious photojournalism programs and competitions in the world. Each year, magazine, newspaper and freelance photographers around the world document the stories, personalities and places that capture our interest and demand our attention. Last year 280 participants were recognized as the best in the world from more than 44,000 submitted images. Now in its 65th year, POYi continues to recognizes excellence in photojournalism, multimedia, and photo editing, setting the gold-standard for excellence.

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WELCOME TO THE 65th COMPETITION

When you enter Pictures of the Year International, your work becomes a part of visual history. Since 1943, POYi continues to be a living and a valuable reflection of human and world events.

We are excited to add a new premiere category to this year's competition. The "Global Vision Award" will recognize coverage of environmental, natural history, or scientific issues. POYi also is expanding its multimedia division with a new category, "Best Multimedia Project," which reflects our profession's growing online importance. And we are unveiling another new category, "Portrait Series."

The online entry process is open from December 21 through the **Friday, January 18 deadline**. The-judging process is an open forum that will select the best from more than 40,000 entries. It begins with the newspaper and general divisions on February 17, then the magazine divisions during the next week, and ends with editing and multimedia on March 7.

Washington, D.C. is our destination for this year's POYi Education and Awards Program on April 17-18, in partnership with the Newseum, National Geographic, the University of Maryland, and the Corcoran College of Art and Design.

Global Vision Award is a new premiere category for the 65th POYi competition.

Global Vision Award

POYi is offering a new premiere category honoring extended coverage of an environmental, natural history, or scientific issue. The recipient of this award will receive a crystal engraved trophy and a cash award of \$1,000.

Portrait Series

This is a new multiple-image category that comple-

ments the single portrait category.

Best Multimedia Projects

The multimedia division will expand to honor the best extended series or project that encompasses a long-form story or multiple chapters. The team will be recognized with a \$500 cash award to the organization and a plaque listing all the participants.

Magazine Single Spreads or Covers Editing

There are two new categories in the Magazine Editing division that are single spreads or covers related to both news and features.

Angus McDougall Award Expanded

In addition to newspapers, judges may now consider a news organization's online component for the Angus McDougall Overall Excellence in Editing Award.

AWARDS AND PRIZES

Photographer of the Year

Newspaper and Magazine Photographers of the Year each will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$1,000 cash award. The runners-up will receive a plaque and a \$500 cash award and the third-place winner will receive a plaque and a \$250 cash award.

World Understanding Award

Multimedia Project is now worth a \$500 cash award.

The winner will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$1,000 cash award.

Global Vision Award

The winner will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$1,000 cash award.

Angus McDougall Overall Excellence in Editing

The winning newspaper will receive, for a year, a sterling silver traveling trophy, a plaque and tuition to the Missouri Photo Workshop.

♦ Community Awareness Award

The winner will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$500 cash award.

One Week's Work

One Week's Work winner will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$500 cash award.

Best Book

The photographer will receive a Tiffany crystal engraved trophy and a \$500 cash award and the publishing house will be recognized with an engraved plaque.

♦ Best Multimedia Project

The first place winner will receive a \$500 cash award to the organization and a plaque listing all the participanting members. The second and third place winners will receive a plaque and a \$250 cash award.

Individual category winners

First place winners in individual categories will receive plaques. All other places in individual categories will receive certificates.

This could include a facet of human relations, a mutual concern for the world environment, a lifting of hope for peace or any number of other topics.

Global Vision Award

45 - GVA - The Global Vision Award will be given to a photographer's story or essay that explores issues related to the environment, natural history, or science. This could include a facet of human impact on the natural world, scientific discovery, coverage of plant or animal habitat, climate concerns, or similar topics.

Community Awareness Award

46 - CAA - The Community Awareness Award recognizes a body of work that demonstrates an understanding of and appreciation for everyday life.

One Week's Work

47 - OWW - One Week's Work will honor the general assignment photojournalist who best demonstrates versatility in covering the diversity of life within a community.

Best Photography Book Award

48 – Book entries must rely primarily on documentary photography and have been published sometime within the last three years (2005, 2006 or 2007).


